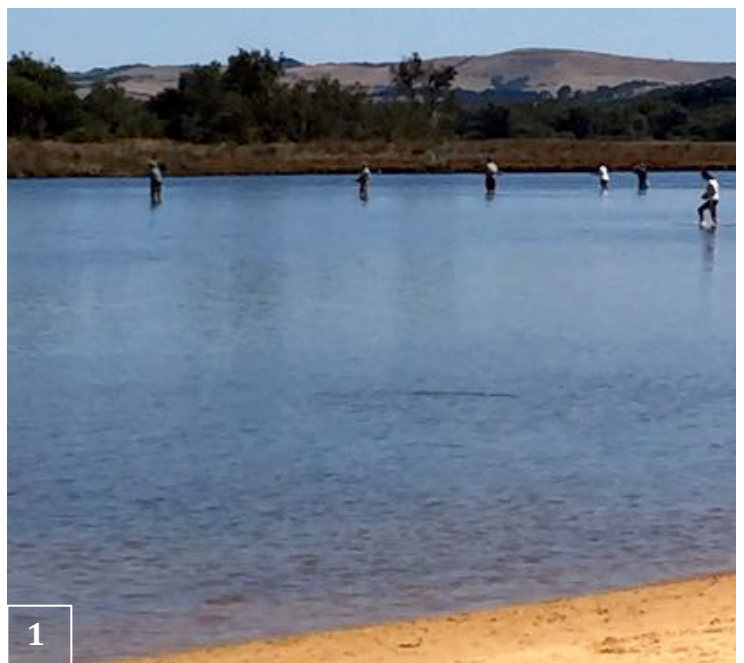
This year the Powlett River trip ran for three days from Friday the 13th of February to Sunday the 15th of February with a strong turnout of both families and intrepid Fly Fishers to try their hand in salt water.

The first night saw the campsite at the Powlett River Caravan Park receive in the vicinity of 40mm of rain, which ensured that the ground was soft for receiving the tent pegs of those arriving on the Saturday. The Dagan's were quite soundly cocooned in a 30ft caravan on the Friday night while Peter Cairns chose to camp out in his swag under the van awning. At least we now know how waterproof these swags are with him being surrounded by flowing water for most of the night. Peter did get to fish on the Friday, however the lightning strikes proved a little confronting.

Saturday saw the arrival of the Clements Family, Daryl Foulds, Jan Horak, Tom Galloway, Les and Roslyn Pratt and the Graham Family (Guests), and the scene was set for the real action to begin. Jan Horak jumped on the scoreboard by landing a nice bream around the 2-pound mark. The remainder of the gang decided to take on the surf in an attempt to find some salmon with Tom Galloway landing one from the rocks at the mouth of the river. The weather had improved considerably by this stage so the children who came along spent the afternoon riding down the sand hills on boogie boards and catching decent size sand crabs that would prove to be a tasty entrée to dinner on the Saturday night.

Sunday turned out to be a magical day and we were joined by Julian Hart who started fishing at dawn. Around 11.00am the waters were calm and the sun was bright with a large amount of fish activity present in the river. With all the fly fisherman lined up in the shallows the President decided to provide his guest Joel Graham with his first fly-casting lessons. On Joel's second ever cast he stripped the bright white clouser through the water and hooked a 2-pound bream. Joel then threw the rod at the President in a panic type gesture for the fish to be landed. It should be noted at this point that the President does not always expect other people to hook his fish for him – although it does help! Joel will now be joining the club with his family and what a great first time experience it was for him. Steve Clements also managed to land a flathead during this peak period and Joel was soon joined by Julian who wanted to cast into the same spot by sitting on his shoulders.

Overall a great weekend with good camaraderie in a beautiful environment that everyone could enjoy. It was also great to see Les Pratt (SFF Minister for Finance) there just after the nasty head injury that he sustained before the trip. I hope that Les has learnt that it is much safer to go fishing than to go to the toilet at home.

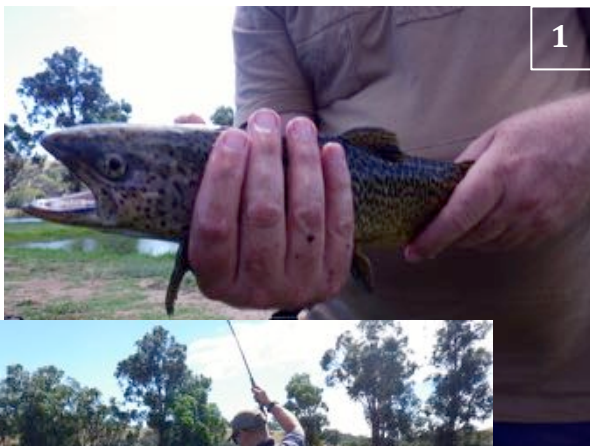
The lake looked most inviting as the sun shone on it and many trout were seen rising and leaping out of the water. Tony Hyett and I assisted the new members to rig their rods demonstrating our knot tying skills and explaining about leaders and tippets. Then selecting flies for them to try.

Craig Foulis, from the trout farm, gave a quick tour of some of the ponds, before we commenced our fishing. Jill McMillan, Dave Boyack, Omri Roets and Malcolm Green spread out around the lake. While Ross Larson, Craig Johnson and Camilo Moreno were assisted by Tony and myself. It did not take Dave and Omri long to land, then release their first catches for the day. Ross landed his first trout caught with a fly while Craig and Camilo tried to understand the principles of casting. The largest hook-up for the morning was Malcolm who caught the back of his head with a misguided cast, aided by a wind gust. He traded his cap for a wide brimmed hat for the afternoon session.

Dave, Omri and Tony were kept busy landing fish and allowing some to release themselves. As Dave and Omri's wives prepared their lunches. Dave went to assist Omri to land another fish. Dave was awarded the Scott Dargan Dolphin Award for his effort of "jumping" into the lake and becoming tangled in a fly line. In full view of all participants. An outstanding effort and a reminder to all to always take a change of clothing.

In all 17 fish were caught during the day with many more being missed. Tony caught 3 ranging in size from 4, 5 & 6 lb. The six pounder was recorded on video and with a still photo.

As the afternoon progressed members began to depart with the last leaving after 5:00PM. All who attended had a great day and we look forward to returning later in the year.

Southern Lights Casting Competition

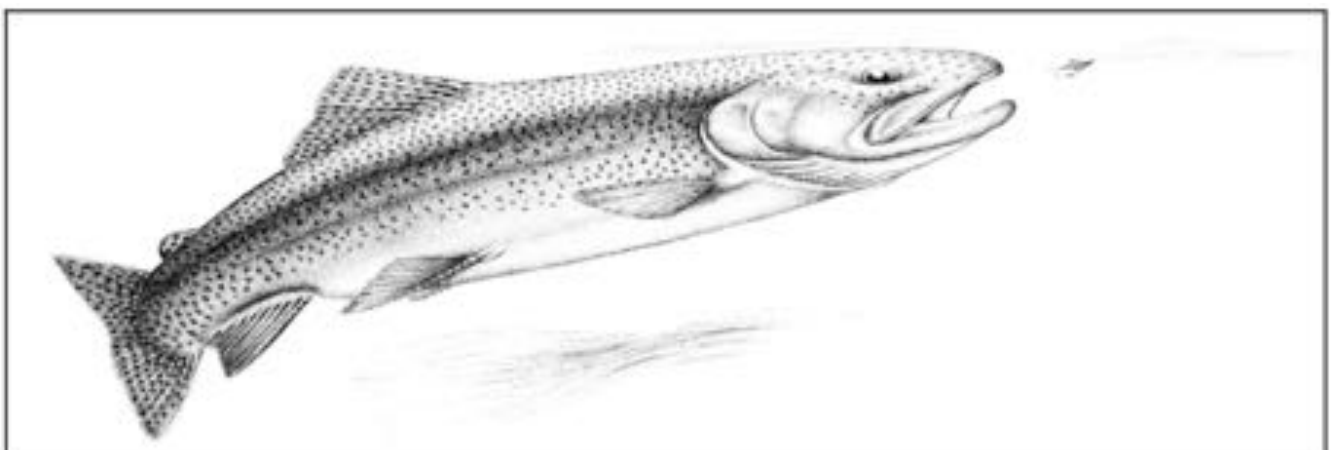
