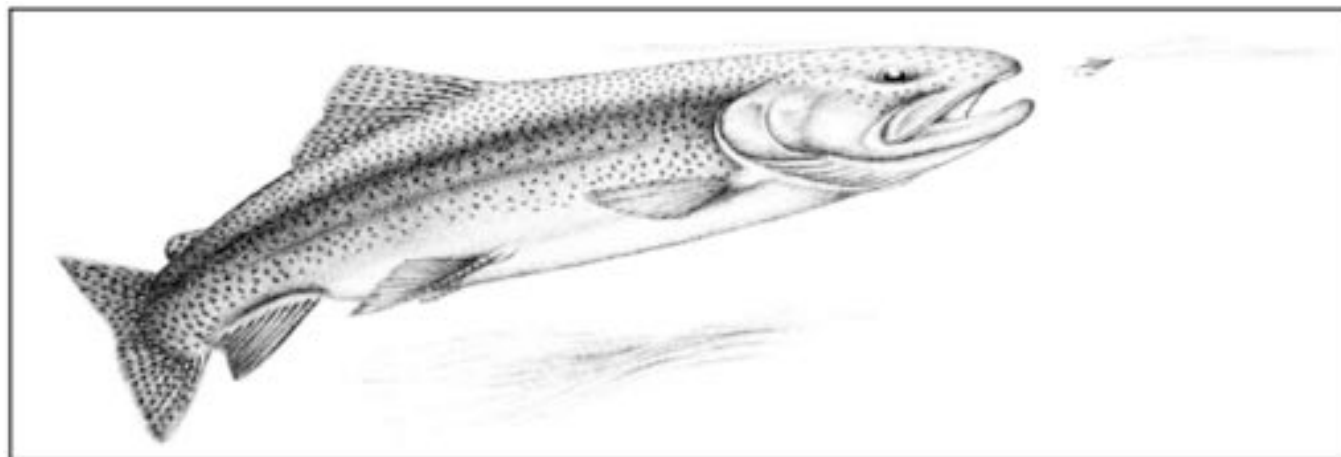

Southern fly fishers greatest, Steven Clements, Malcolm Green, Phil Magness, Paul Harris, Ross Larson, Julian Hart, James Howden and Tony Hyett gathered at the Millbrook Lakes cabins ready to show the world how it is done.

The three guides David Dodd, Craig Coltman and Philip Weigall were at all times most obliging and great to have as guides and mentors. They led us to many fish and took us to some of Victorias best kept trout fishing lakes. Leading us to good fish does not mean we were in dowered with great success. We did our best, as only the best can do, but found the fish quite uncooperative. Over the two and a half days of fishing we were only able to net about twenty five fish. The biggest just over 4lb was unfortunately caught by Steven Clements who also unfortunately caught the most fish, 4 for the trip. Whereas myself only catching 3, the biggest a magnificent 4lbr.

Fortunately our new members were able to snare a number of fish themselves and being guided by the best, learned heaps about fly fishing.

During the weekend we all had numerous hits and many follows as we worked the waters with all types of wet flies, one of mine being the fire engine designed engineered and tied by myself, sporting a long red marabou tail, not me the fly. We tried many different retrieve methods but the fish in general were not all that cooperative, but still one of my favourite places to fish.

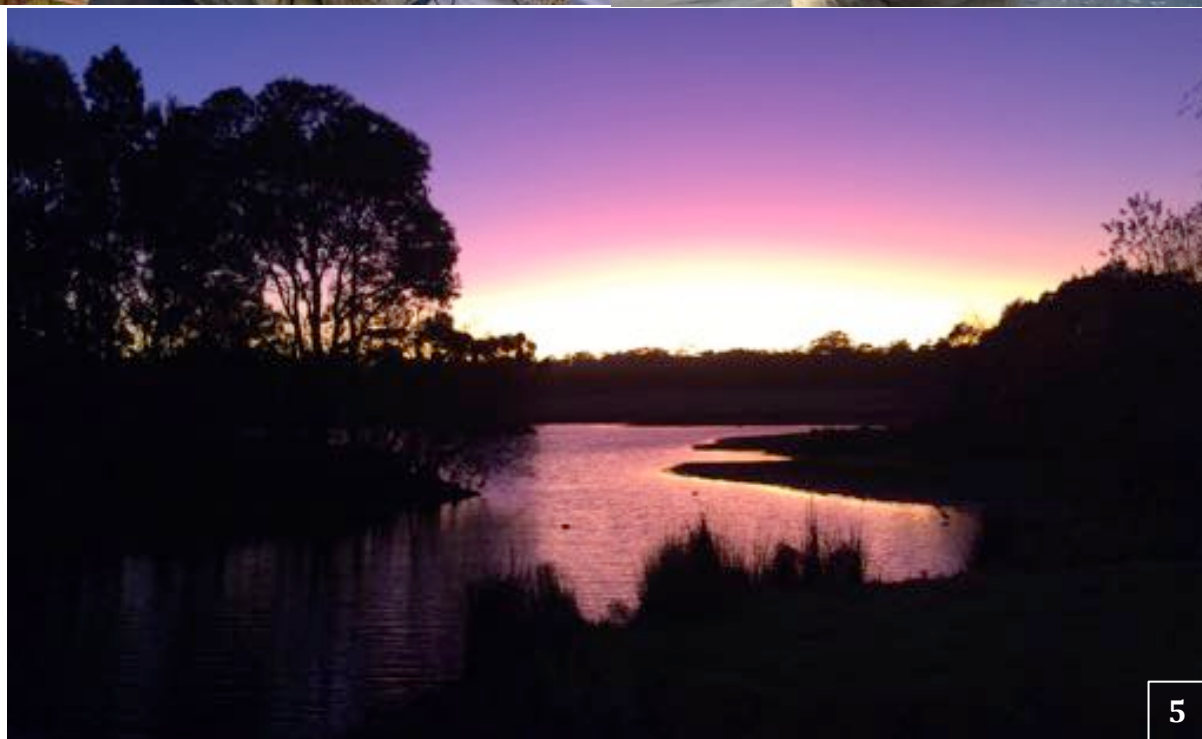
Highlights of the trip. Well there were plenty. Two of the best involved Malcolm Green. The first while fishing, Malcolm put his rod down to obtain a gink bottle from his vest behind him only to turn round to see his rod sliding down the bank towards the water. Malcolm dived at the rod with the speed of a 1,000 Gazelles, picking it up only to feel no weight on the line. Number two while being guided by Phil Weigall, Malcolm hooked up on a cracker, estimate 8lb, that jumped out of the water close by a number of times and dashed around for a few minutes, wrapped the line around a sunken tree branch and snapped him off. A major pity but nothing anyone could have done. Phil disappointed for Malcolm waded into the lake retrieved the branch and through it with contempt well up onto the bank.

The lakes, as always were in great condition even though quite low as normal for this time of year.

There is never a shortage of laughs at our club trips and this trip was no exception. The guides are always up for plenty of fun and create some themselves.

The Wallace pub is a great venue for the evening meal and the food is always good. Next year we may run these trips at a different time so we can catch Dunn, Caddis and Prolific Midge hatches.

Six 4wd enthusiasts and four capable cars all meet at Heyfield Bakery for the obligatory coffee before setting off for the adventure. Heading out through Valencia/Boisdale we turned onto Mt Angus Track, drove a while until we turned left on to Stans Track. The track had a few challenges, the usual mud and water (the area had 150mm of rain in the past week), but nothing the experienced drivers couldn't handle. Quite a few hills were conquered and steep downhills overcome. We continued along until the track became the Moroka track, the track had several fallen trees causing some tight squeezes between fallen logs and steep drop offs. Peter Cairns found one fallen tree a bit too close for comfort and sadly slipped into the tree trunk piercing his near new tyre on the sidewall. But alas, he got to try out his tyre changing techniques. One tyre replaced in 10 minutes on a slippery wet track in the freezing cold with Joe Lauinger ably assisting. Les Pratt almost fell victim to the same tree but manoeuvred around successfully. Grant Dawson and Peter Golding were able to pass with no issues. We stopped at Moroka Hut for a brief while before heading towards our campsite that night. Heading along Tamborithia road towards Shaw Creek we stopped to collect firewood as we were expecting a cold night.

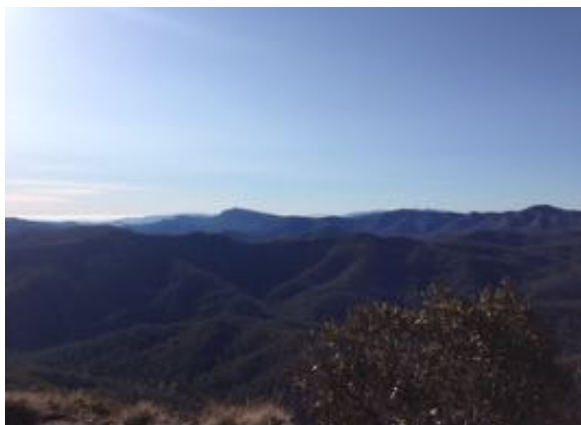
We were expecting a cold night but it turned out to be a freezing night (literally). Jim Johnson (designated fire starter!) set about starting the fire as we started dining with a selection of local and imported cheeses and pates. We struggled to get the firewood to burn, several methods were used to start the fire (all safe methods!!). Jim finally got the fire going, we heated up dinner and enjoyed the camp fire and story swapping. That night the temperature dipped to minus 7.8 degrees. We woke the next morning and the temperature was still minus 5.3 degrees. Everything was frozen, the washing up bucket was solid ice, puddles had frozen and Joe and his broken zipper sleeping bag needed a blow torch to get moving again. We gave fishing a miss as we figured it was too cold and we would of have to break the ice of our rods anyway.

Next day we head up Mt Howitt Road stopping at several scenic points and Howitt Hut. We followed the road along to King Billy Track and on to Bluff Track heading towards Lovicks Hut. The track progressively got rocky and muddy much to Les Pratt's delight. You couldn't wipe the smile of Grant Dawson's face, particularly through one very very muddy track. The driving tested our skills but we remained entertained by Peter Golding commenting about how much he enjoys rocky driving. We stopped for a break at Picture Point; elevation was about 1600m with the most amazing views over the High Country towards Mt Buller. Lovick Hut was occupied so we continued along until we all decided we had had enough driving and found a clearing and camped. The clearing was at about 1500m, set amongst beautiful snow gums and provided the perfect setting to our final night in the High Country.

Next morning we woke to the campfire roaring, thanks to early riser Joe and the most beautiful sun rising over the snow gums. We cooked up bacon, sausages and eggs for breakfast and slowly packed up. We set up the cars for the obligatory photo taken by Jim Johnson and Peter Golding and then headed off past Bluff Hut onto Sheepyard Flat, arriving at Mansfield bakery about 1:00pm. Talk has begun for next year's trip, the only request being a bit earlier in the year – just to avoid the icy nights!!

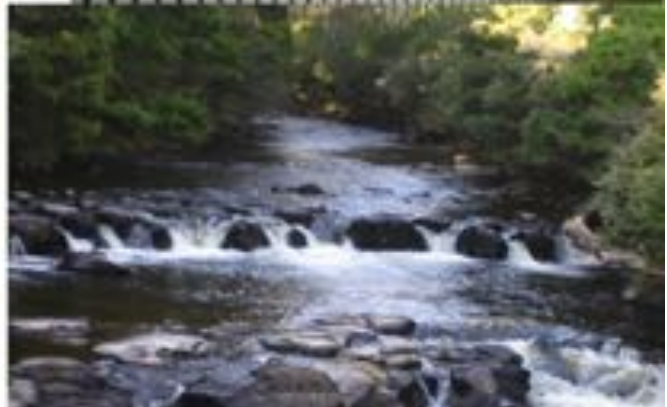
