It is with great sadness that I report the passing of Charles on Saturday 31st October.

Charles's family migrated from Scotland when he was 5 years old. They settled in Adelaide where he attended school and once he became an adult he moved to Melbourne for a short time before moving to Sydney. He had numerous sales positions with various companies before deciding on settling back in Melbourne.

Once back in Melbourne he acquired enough capital to open two Orotan stores, one in The Block Arcade, Melbourne and another in Toorak Road South Yarra. The shop in Toorak Road was underneath the Turkish Consulate and became famous in 1986 when an Armenian Terrorist set a car bomb which prematurely exploded killing one terrorist and injuring the other. The bomb blast damaged 20 shops along Toorak Road including Charles's shop, which was completely destroyed.

Never one to be deterred Charles started looking for other opportunities. He had already been working as a part time sales representative for a chemical company while operating his two shops but after the bombing he decided that he knew enough about the chemical industry to start his own business. Over the next 25 years of determination and hard work he turned it into a very successful and profitable business. It was during this time that he met, fell in love and married Judy.

Upon the sale of his business at retirement some 7 years ago he wanted to pursue his passion of fishing, particularly fly fishing which he believed he had never mastered. He joined the Southern Fly Fishers after being introduced by John Worrell after they literally bumped into each other at Armadale Angling. After coffee and a chat Charles was sold on the virtues of the club and joined soon after. He was a very active member and it wasn't long before he volunteered his services when needed. He was still the raffle master right up to the end and organised prizes via Judy when in hospital.

It was here that I met Charles and with his very likable and friendly nature he was invited to join our small coffee group which meets religiously every Wednesday morning. Fly fishing and the planning of future fishing trips is the main topic of discussion over coffee and with Charles's organisational and computer skills he volunteered to book airfares, accommodation, guides when required and anything else necessary. Charles had a long history of fishing in New Zealand and he was instrumental in starting our annual New Zealand fishing trips.

Charles's culinary skills were legendary and whenever we had to cook for ourselves on a trip he would commandeer the kitchen/BBQ and always deliver delicious mouth-watering meals.

A few years ago Charles approached me to teach him the tasks required for the International Federation of Fly Fishers Certified Casting course (CCI). We agreed to meet every morning Monday to Friday with Charles supplying the hot coffees.

Charles was focussed and determined and over the following months I was delighted with his progress. He practiced constantly and I remember vividly how elated he was when he achieved an 80' cast without a tail. His mends, wiggles, targets and roll casts were all coming together nicely. During this time we became very close friends and enjoyed many social outings with our wives.

We were devastated in April when we heard the news that Charles was to undergo an operation to remove a tumour from his lung. Although the operation went well he was advised to have radiotherapy followed by chemotherapy over the next 10 months. He agreed on the condition that the treatment would have to be postponed for 10 days in October as he had a fishing trip organised with his mates.

Unfortunately Charles was not well enough to be on that fishing trip to Hinchinbrook Channel but he enjoyed our many phone calls describing our daily activities during the trip.

During Charles's treatment he insisted on continuing with his CCI tasks and I knew on most occasions he was very ill and in pain but he never complained. I told him many times that he was an inspiration to us all.

Charles was admitted to hospital on his 69th birthday in October with a persistent infection. Regrettably his health deteriorated and he died 3 weeks later.

Condolences and sympathies from the Southern Fly Fishers have been passed onto to his wife Judy and other family members.

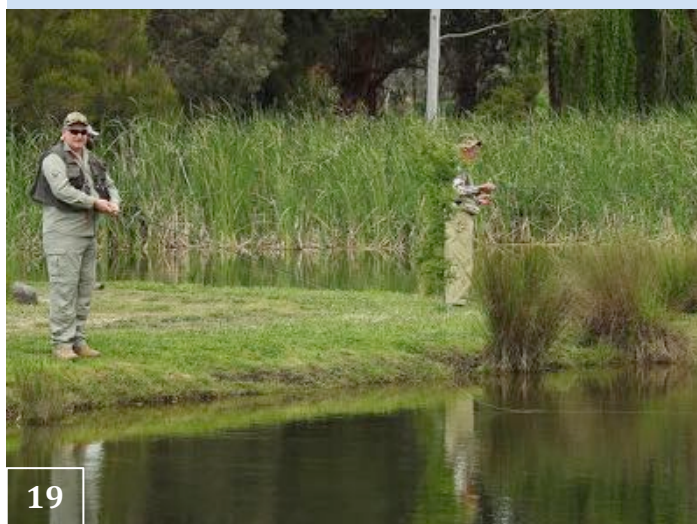

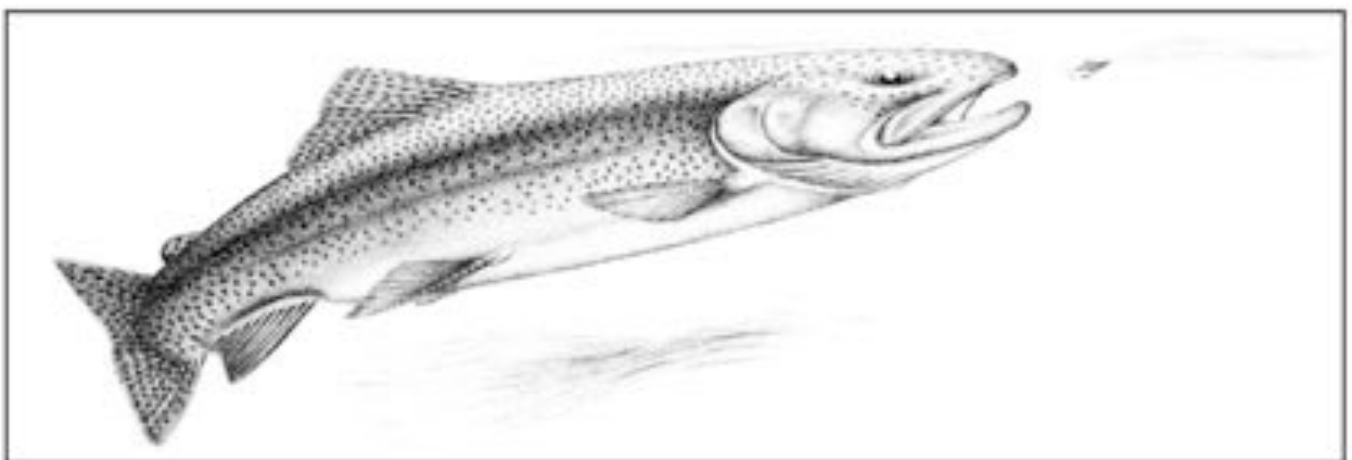
