A number of fish caught Friday evening at Cabin Lake made for a good start to the weekend. A red blood worm was working well for Julian with his patience being a virtue. Phil was on heat all weekend and despite this handicap was able to catch a number of good fish. It was a little tough for the rest of us with me dropping about eight good size slippery fish.

Jeff Allan was able to snare a 5lbr & a 3lbr and two smaller ones a good catch by a beginner for the weekend, he sported a massive smile for the balance of the trip.

I kept up my standard of dropping fish until Sunday afternoon with extreme expertise was able to roll cast 50 to 60 feet with a 120km wind behind me.

I think this wind excited the fish and coupled with the mite of my red marabou streamer pattern, affectionately labelled the fire engine, I was able to land a 4lbr and a 3lbr on Siberia dam. It was a difficult task to even stand up on the banks of Siberia; I nearly blew into the dam many times.

Things were heating up at Siberia when Doddie, one of the guides phone rang, after a few minutes conversation with a distressed Jim, the other guide at Cabin Lake we were informed we had to return to Cabin Lake straight away.

A tree had been blown over on to a couple of our cars. So leaving a firing dam we took off to peruse the damage.



A very large pine had come down and wrote of Julian's car and damaged Allan Russell's. This massive tree trunk missed my car by a narrow six feet.

I was a lucky boy.

With no one close and no damage to the cabins we all breathed a sigh of relief except Julian and Allan; at least their cars were driveable.

To the land owners credit the area was made safe the next day.

In these blustery conditions fishing is usually quite difficult so many retrieving techniques were performed with a number of fly changes taking place to try to snare a few fish.

Over all we did quite well with about twenty fish taken in very picturesque conditions.

26 members fished on the day with a further 9 kids and partners cheering from the sidelines as many fine well fed trout breached the surface of the lake to add to individual tallies.

When the whistle blew to commence the competition and prime positions were secured, a lull fell across the lake as the fish recovered from the juniors' onslaught. Soon after however the action began again.

First fish caught for the day was a contested outcome with both Ken and Steve claiming the honour. With a prize of 2 flies on offer it appeared that a duel, the selected weapons being

5wts, was the only means to solve this gentleman's argument. The trip leader however proposed a face saving sharing of the prize, one fly each and although there was some disagreement about who should be the first to choose, it was eventually resolved to the satisfaction of both parties.

The usual donated flies will also be located in these display cabinets, so will still be able to get yourself a genuine Max Kepert fly.




