Over the Queen's Birthday weekend, 10 - 12 June six intrepid club members drove to Inverloch to enjoy some salt water fly fishing.

This trip had been planned for some time but for a variety of reasons had been postponed on two occasions. Les Pratt, Scott Dargan and I had over several months had discussions about arranging such a weekend. As I would be away for the month before the weekend, arriving home with jetlag a few days before, Les volunteered to be trip leader. We had both collected some valuable information from the Inverloch locals in the preceding months. Les before going to Weipa circulated some very informative Trip Notes. The day after arriving home from overseas I had a call from Les. Could I take over as trip leader as he was incapacitated, due to a fishing accident at Weipa.

The arrangements were that each participant would make their own accommodation arrangements, with some assistance from the trip notes. We would then meet at 10:00am Saturday, outside the Anderson Inlet Angling Club.

Chris Colman, Frankie James, Ray Boast, John Pratt and myself congregated in the sunshine to work out our beats and strategies. Chis had already checked out the waters by the clubhouse and had some positive reports. I had visited Rod Bendings World, a local marine activity shop in the main street of Inverloch (rodbendingsworld.com) the previous afternoon and informed of the locations for Couta, Mullet, Salmon and Whiting. All which could be fished from the shore. High tide was to be at about 1:00pm. For those not familiar with Anderson Inlet it has a tidal change averaging 2 metres and runs very fast through the inlet. Sinking lines are recommended with weighted flies. Low tides reveal many deep channels which can be easily reached by walking on the exposed sand bars.

Frankie and Ray chose to fish at Screw Creek, which flows into the inlet near the end of the camping ground. Chris was to explore more of the point near Screw Creek and Jon and I fished in front of the Angling Club. The weather was fine with just a gentle breeze behind us. Wading out to knee deep Jon caught a juvenile salmon on his first cast, what a way to start. Not long after we could see Chris's rod bend then mine. A great place to fish. We also watched as a large stingray swam along in front of us. We took the precaution of not casting near it, just in case it took our fly.

The lunchtime reports were all very positive with all men catching multiples, the count was 29 salmon, all released. Chris who was wet wading had the most with nine caught. The local shops were supported as the hungry fishermen explored what the local suppliers offered.

Following a refuelling and the tide change it was off to catch some more fish. We all chose to fish the channel from Screw Creek and wade out as the tide allowed. Standing in knee deep water on a firm sand base the water was warm and the sun on our back encouraged us to enjoy the location and the fishing. Looking at others in the water it reminded me of scenes from Christmas Island, with Chris wet wading. With the outgoing tide, the fishing was not as productive as the morning session but by the time we all left the water, the team had landed more than fifty fish.

That evening we, along with Kay Boast and Jill McMillan, enjoyed a meal at the Inlet Hotel in Inverloch, where many fishing stories were exchanged. Along with getting to know each other a little better. Frankie retired to his tent while others their motel room, B&B, unit or private house. We all woke refreshed and ready for action on the Sunday, meeting again at 10:00am. Ray took leave from fishing to visit some local markets with Kay before driving home to Melbourne 1.45 hours away. Frankie returned to Screw Creek while Chris, Jon and I fished near the Angling Club House. The holiday makers were out in force walking along the beach with friends, children and dogs all enjoying the sunshine and taking time to observe these men standing in the water fly fishing. Unfortunately, we had caught all the fish the day before or they were still spooked from yesterday. There was just no interest in our flies. Then the wind increased and so the three of us decided to seek out another fishing location in the inlet.


First stop was Mahers Landing, which was even more exposed and has a very rocky bed. Not good for today but would be great for flatheads in the future. Then to Tarwin Lower boat ramp. This is on the Tarwin River which has fishing platforms positioned at regular intervals along a two-km distance. All were occupied; the open area by the boat ramp was wall-to-wall deck chairs for the bait fishermen. Off to Venus Bay stopping at several access points to Anderson Inlet and talking to locals for some more fishing knowledge. It appeared none were having much success. Our final stop was at Stevies Gutter, which is opposite Inverloch. We interrupted a large family group who were using several baited lines but only catching "bait" while we were there. Chris and Jon moved away from the group to explore the water. They caught a couple more juvenile salmon but were encouraged to see the area of accessible mangroves and plan to revisit when the weather warms.

Monday the weather changed and the rains came so any of the group still in the area made a return to their homes.

It was a great trip with many fish caught and the area explored for future individual or club trips. I am looking forward to fishing with Les in the area as part of his recovery in Spring.

Attendees: Tony Hyett, Adrian Hughes, Allan Russell, Phil Magness Southern members and the ring in Ian Bell, Adrian's mate.

These five extraordinary specimens of male domination joined together to tear the fishing dams of Millbrook apart. Well we had a deterrent ahead of us in the form of very cold weather patterns. Cold, well yes we had to rug up. I made the mistake of leaving my waders and boots outside the first night to find them frozen solid in the morning and impossible to drag on until I defrosted them in Cabin Lake to soften them up.

Phil Weigall was our guide for the weekend and what a massive help he was. Ian Bell being quite a novice was the first to experience Phil's teaching ability landing two six pound fish in the first session then over the duration of the trip was able to snare a couple more fish around three pound each. This weekend for Ian was an experience of a lifetime, he was over the moon.

Allan Russell brought in two wonderful three pounders at Harbour dam right in front of me. I could almost hear him say cop that uncle Tony but luckily I landed a nice three pounder myself soon after. Phil Magness found it a little tougher at Harbours dropping a couple of fish. Adrian Hughes landed seven fish for the weekend including four & five pounders. I was lucky enough to land a five and a half and a five pounder and two threes and a couple of smaller fish.

Highland waters, now leased by Millbrook lakes was very protected from the winds and the four lakes were in spectacular condition sporting a very active midge hatch fish feeding frenzy very late in the day. We were able to land a few good size fish including a beautiful four and a half pounder right at the end of the day by Phil Magnes. I was at one of the Highland waters dams fishing from the wall when I saw what I thought were three fish cursing the shallows coming towards me. These three fish turned out to be one large specimen that sniffed my nymph then took off into the abyss. It had to be between six and eight pound. I was fortunate enough about a year earlier to land an eight pounder at the same spot.

This trip to Millbrook was one of the most exciting I have experienced. About thirty fish landed over the weekend. Not a large amount for five fishermen but a good number of large fish landed. The sight fishing, watching large fish cruising and being able to cast and land some was a Fly Fisherman's dream. A number of fish were dropped and missed at the strike

stage so something interesting was happening most of the time. All the dams where in great condition and a pleasure to fish

These waters are stocked yearly with yearlings and often a number of larger specimens. All the dams have plenty of feed so fish grow at quite a fast rate, giving us a good chance to land large fish.

A trip well worthwhile.

The usual donated flies will also be located in these display cabinets, so will still be able to get yourself a genuine Max Kepert fly.


The flies are for sale at a price of \$1.50 each. Please see a committee member for payment on the night.
