The CVFFC held a meeting at YVFFC Lilydale on the 22nd July. The following details cover some of the areas discussed:-

- The President discussed the new VFA body. For further information please check the link to VFA (Victorian Fishing Authority) web site. https://vfa.vic.gov.au The new Authority replaces the Department of Fisheries and takes over that role.
- Travis Dowling requested comment from the CVFFC regarding the "Proposed Changes
 to Salmonid Regulations by Fisheries Notice". Based on the responses from clubs and
 delegates CVFFC informed Fisheries that we agreed with the proposed new
 regulations.
- Impact of proposed Hydro scheme on the Rubicon River. Reference below:http://www.theage.com.au/victoria/can-local-hydro-get-the-green-light-in-victoria-20170407-vg78v.html
 - Several members were concerned about the proposed hydro scheme planed for the Rubicon River. At present the CVFFC does not support the Rubicon Hydro Scheme until an Environmental Impact Study has been carried out and made available to our members. ATF and NFA have carried out an onsite assessment with the applicant (only verbal reports provided). CVFFC would appreciate it if interested clubs could do their own research and provide information, for clubs to comment on.
- CVFFC is in the process of issuing appropriate guidelines on the use of Facebook and Instagram posts. CVFFC is also seeking an interested delegate/member to manage Facebook and Instagram.
- DRAFT proposal/suggestions will be provide on fly only waters, single hook or barbless hook waters, catch and release only waters etc. for members to comments and provide feedback.
- MTB proposed \$20 million cover instead of \$10 million. At present all clubs have \$10 million cover. Fisheries (Stronger Fishing Club Defibrillator Program Stronger Fishing Club Defibrillator Program) and Parks Victoria list a minimum of \$20 million as required cover. A motion was put forward that CVFFC adopt the \$20 million cover.
- Wild Trout Conference proposed for 5th November at Mansfield. Save the date.
- CVFFC web site has been running for some time. http://www.cvffc.org.au/ Any comments or feedback appreciated.
- Next meeting 28th October Saturday AGM Snobs Creek Eildon. All executive positions will be vacated and positions open for election.

Since my last update, VRFish have been involved in the following items.

- Trout size limits and change of regulations. VRFish prepared a proposal to VFA with comment on the survey results and a high level of support for the recommendations.
- Volunteers to help out at the VRFish Boat Show stand were requested. Doug Braham (YVFFC/CVFFC) and Peter te Hennepe (SFFC/CVFFC) assisted on the stand.
- National Carp Action Plan. The intent by year end is to have approvals in place to release the virus.
- VRFish has been requested by Fisheries Victoria (now the Victorian Fisheries Authority) to provide comment on the continuation of the Fisheries Notices for trout cod and Murray cod. The Fisheries Notices are business as usual with no changes made to existing regulations, which include: A slot limit of 40-50 cm and bag limit of 1 for trout cod in Lake Sambell and Kerferd. A slot limit of 55-75cm and bag limit of 1 in rivers and 2 in impoundments for Murray cod. Removal of the closed season for Murray cod in Eildon. VRFish's submission is consistent with previous submissions made and provides support for most key elements. CVFFC wrote to VRFish in support of the VFA proposal.
- CVFFC requested that discussion on the proposed development of hydro power generation on the Rubicon River be included on the agenda of the next meeting on the 12th August.

Note these are only some of the topics discussed.

All items may not be specifically applicable to fly fishing but were included for general interest. The items which were applicable were forwarded to the SFF secretary for action if required.



A group of about 12 Southern members gathered together at this picturesque reservoir last month to entertain themselves for the day. Well it was good that we could because the fishing was quite tough, only about eight fish caught. Myself, well I blanked not a touch very unusual.

The weather was cold not much wind, just a ripple on the water. There were a few fish sighted moving and I mean a few. Ray Goddard caught a nice one and a half pounder exactly where I instructed Frankie blue suite to fish earlier, amongst the fallen trees.

The wall section of this reservoir is quite deep but most of this impoundment is quite shallow enabling a wade out from most banks to over 200 mts. The water condition was good but a little cloudy, making it tough for sight fishing.

Ross Bailey stayed till just before dark experiencing a midge hatch with a few fish feeding but was unable to snare any more than the two he caught earlier in the day, still a good catch rate. Midge feeders, the fish not our members, are very hard to catch requiring a certain style of fishing coupled with the correct flies and retrieve but can be worth the wait till just before sun set and into the dark with big fish coming in to feed on these tiny insects

Wet flies were the go for the day with plenty of tough flogging and patience required to try and hook up. This reservoir has been fishing very well for some time with past info from fly fisherman outside Southern catching a number of three pounders and up. I feel the low water level pushed the fish into the deeper water.

This water way is worth visiting often a great fishery.

Good turn up by our members it makes the organising worthwhile.



Just another well attended trip from Southern Fly Fishers with 20 members turning up to have a crack at this very beautiful group of about 16 waters.

Brad, an extremely pleasant fly fisherman has, after buying the fishery, done a massive amount of work to bring this venue up to the great standard it is. Accommodation cabins very clean toilets and groomed grass ways around dams to make ex

access easy. He informed me that he is installing a bore pump to take water up to the top dam that will allow a consistent water flow through channels linking the dams all the way to the bottom dam. This will enable fish to spawn, water to be better oxygenated and better quality fish. These dams do have a water flow from an above valley creek with consistent rain and the pump moving water in dry times.

Twenty spectacular members turned up, they just kept coming. With plenty of bank area and dams to fish our members were far from tripping over each other. Rainbows, browns and golden trout were caught but not as many as we had hoped. There were a few large fish dropped unfortunately and only about 25 fish released for the day.

Flies used were mainly wets stripped at different rates. The deeper the better seemed to be the best way to pick up the fish. Some of these dams are quite small being gravel pits that made them quite deep.

Cold, first thing in the morning made it quite difficult to use the dunnies for about an hour till it thawed out. We were all running around holding the front of our pants.

Great day had by all

The big bottom dam holds a number of different species of fish including large yellow belly, trout and a few one metre Cod all of which we had trouble catching.

The usual donated flies will also be located in these display cabinets, so will still be able to get yourself a genuine Max Kepert fly.




Accommodation Offers
