After a fairly cold winter, trout season is back. We will have to wait and see if there is any more decent rain this spring but the long-range forecasters are saying we are likely to have average rainfall with slighter warmer temperatures. The bumper snow falls in the last couple of weeks will certainly provide some extra melted water into the steam flows. This season also commences with some new regulations for trout fishing. As of Saturday 2nd September 2017, coinciding with the reopening of trout season, the following changes occurred:

- 1. Introduction of a 25 cm minimum size for trout and reduced bag limit from 5 to 3 trout for the following waters:
 - Ovens River (upstream of Porepunkah Bridge),
 - Mitta Mitta River (upstream of Lake Dartmouth),
 - Nariel Creek (upstream of Colac Colac bridge),
 - Rubicon River.
- 2. Introduction of a 45cm minimum size for brown trout and 30cm minimum size for rainbow trout in Toolondo Reservoir with a reduced bag limit from 5 to 3 trout per day.
- 3. Introduction of a 45 cm minimum size for trout in Hepburn Lagoon with a reduced bag limit from 5 to 3 trout per day.
- 4. Removal of the trout closed season for the Hopkins and Merri rivers.

On the opening weekend, and last weekend, members made the most of some good weather and I look forward to hearing all the fishing reports on Wednesday's members' night. You can check out Garry's post on Southern Flyfishers' Facebook page who wasted no time getting out there with James and catching some nice Browns.

The winter fly tying course is proving to be a success with much support from Ross Bailey, Peter Gadd, Peter Golding and Paul Harris. And then of course, you can drop in on Paul Harris's fly tying nights every third Thursday of the month.

The Max Kepert Cup is fast approaching - Sunday 22nd October. This is our premier fishing day event for the year. This is a great fun day with always plenty of fish to be caught and enjoy a BBQ and for a lucky few, win a few great prizes. If you are new to the sport, there is no better day than this to put your casting practice to the test and catch a fish or two, or three. 




Accommodation Offers
