Laurent and John McIntyre left at 5.30 am to meet Flo at the Thornton café then fish upstream of Macmaster's lane. The water was flowing very low at around 120 mgf's. No trouble to walk across the Goulburn at most places.

Laurent lands a good size one in the bare willows. Flo and myself continue up to the Rubicon. If you have ever followed Flo, liken it to chasing a Chamonix around the French Alps. Laurent lands a 5lb rainbow in the Rubicon confluence.

Hard fishing so we retire for lunch. Flo and Laurent return to the Rubicon area and have multiple catches of smaller fish.

There are some days when fishing is hard and ideally we could have had a little more flow.

But watching the fishing comps the next week at Thornton even the experts have difficult days.



The Steavenson River seemed a likely venue for our new members to gain some invaluable info on stream craft from our mentors Tony Hyett, John McIntyre and Allan Russell.

The forecast for the day was not inviting with hail storms and rain predicted during the whole day. Considering these conditions only one member made it to the day, Frankie James, who seemed not to be detoured by the forecast. I don't blame anyone for pulling out.

Upon arrival we discovered due to the previous nights rain the Stevo, Rubi and Acheron were all running high and dirty, so off to the Goulburn River starting at the Thornton bridge. The Goulburn was very low but very clear and looking great. John McIntyre went off upstream and the rest of us downstream.

All three of us fished roughly the same area. The low river flow allowed us to cross at a number of spots and also to comfortably wade to the middle of the river enabling us to fish the willows and deeper runs along the opposite banks. I was able to pick up three fish the largest about half a pound and drop four others on a double tungsten bead head red nymph. The other guys picked up the odd fish but nothing of any size.

I was standing in the middle of the river under the wonderful brimmed hat donated so generously to myself by Judy Cameron feeling a slight chill in the air and looking up into a sky that was as black as the inside of a dogs guts. Down came a few hail stone the size of over inflated footballs. Panic set in as my waterproof jacket was in my fly jacket on my back. As I moved towards the riverbank the arse fell out of the sky dumping thousands of frozen water balls on me. The only thing that saved my ears was my new hat, what a gem. I staggered on towards the bank tripped over a weed hidden log and saturated my thick shirt in only about a foot of water. Anyway, I fished on like the hero I am until a couple of hours later, after a few rain showers hypothermia set in. That was it for me and as it was about 4 pm on a tough days fishing everyone else decided to call it a day as well.

The VFFA on the same day had a comp running and just above us Erhan Cinar and John Kruscha were fishing their brains out trying to win the comp. Lucky I was there and was able to pass on my expertise to them, I am sure making the fishing easier for them.

Well as all good fishermen do at the end of a very cold winter's day we headed off to the Thornton cafe for a large ice-cream cone each.

All in all a good day with a number of fish rising to small emergers with Allan gaining a couple of hits on a small grey Klinkhammer. Tough to catch on a calm clear water day.

The Goulburn is one of our great reliable rivers.

Go Tie a Fly – Shaving Brush

Colour – most common colours are grey, brown and black.

Sizes – 10, 12, 14

Imitation – represents a variety of emerging Duns. Colours and sizes are species and location dependant.



Materials:	HOOK	Dry Fly size 10 -14 (fine wire)
	THREAD	Black 6/0 or 8/0. Use 6/0 if you are not experienced in tying and flaring deer hair.
	TAIL	Black cock fibres for black and grey versions, brown versions sometimes use pheasant tail fibres.
	BODY	Dark dubbing mix or pheasant tail for brown
	RIB	Fine copper wire
	WINGS	Natural deer hair
	HEAD	Brown dubbing

Tying Instructions:

1. Start thread just a couple of mm behind the eye and wind to half way down the shank.
2. Tie in the ribbing wire on the side closest to you and wind in the thread over the rib to the bend of the hook. Allow the rib to hang down.
3. Strip half a dozen tail fibres from the cock feather making sure they are of equal length. Measure them against the shank to approx. 3/4 of the shank length and tie in on top of the hook at the bend. Leave the thread at 1/2 way along the shank.
4. Dub a fine rope of body material leaving some thread between the hook and start of the dubbing rope. Wind back to the bend, start the dubbing at the bend winding forward to the eye creating a fine carrot shaped body 2/3 of the way to the eye.
5. Wind in the ribbing 4-5 turns to the thread, tie in with several turns of thread and trim the rib.

Go Tie a Fly – Shaving Brush (cont.)

6. Cut and stack approximately half a pencil width of deer hair. Hold the stack at the base of the deer hair and measure the tie in point to one shank length. Holding the hair stack above the tie in point and parallel to the shank take one loose turn around the stack at the tie in point. Slowly draw the thread down until the stack is sitting on the hook, this will stop the deer hair from spreading unevenly around the hook. Take a couple loose turns around the hook then slowly increase the pressure on the thread until the deer hair flares in to a cone shape wing. Do not let go of the base of the deer hair or it will spin. **The deer hair will not be locked in until you have several tight wraps.** Trim the deer hair at the base of the wing leaving a couple of mm protruding at the thread, this is easier to do if you never let go of the deer hair during the process.

7. Dub a fine rope on to the thread. Grasp the hair wing while maintaining pressure on the thread. Pull the wing up and back and wind the dubbing around the hook between the wing and eye. Build up a ball of dubbed thread to hold the wing at approx. 45 degrees to the hook shank. This can be done in stages, once you are happy the eye is clear of deer hair whip finish and lacquer.

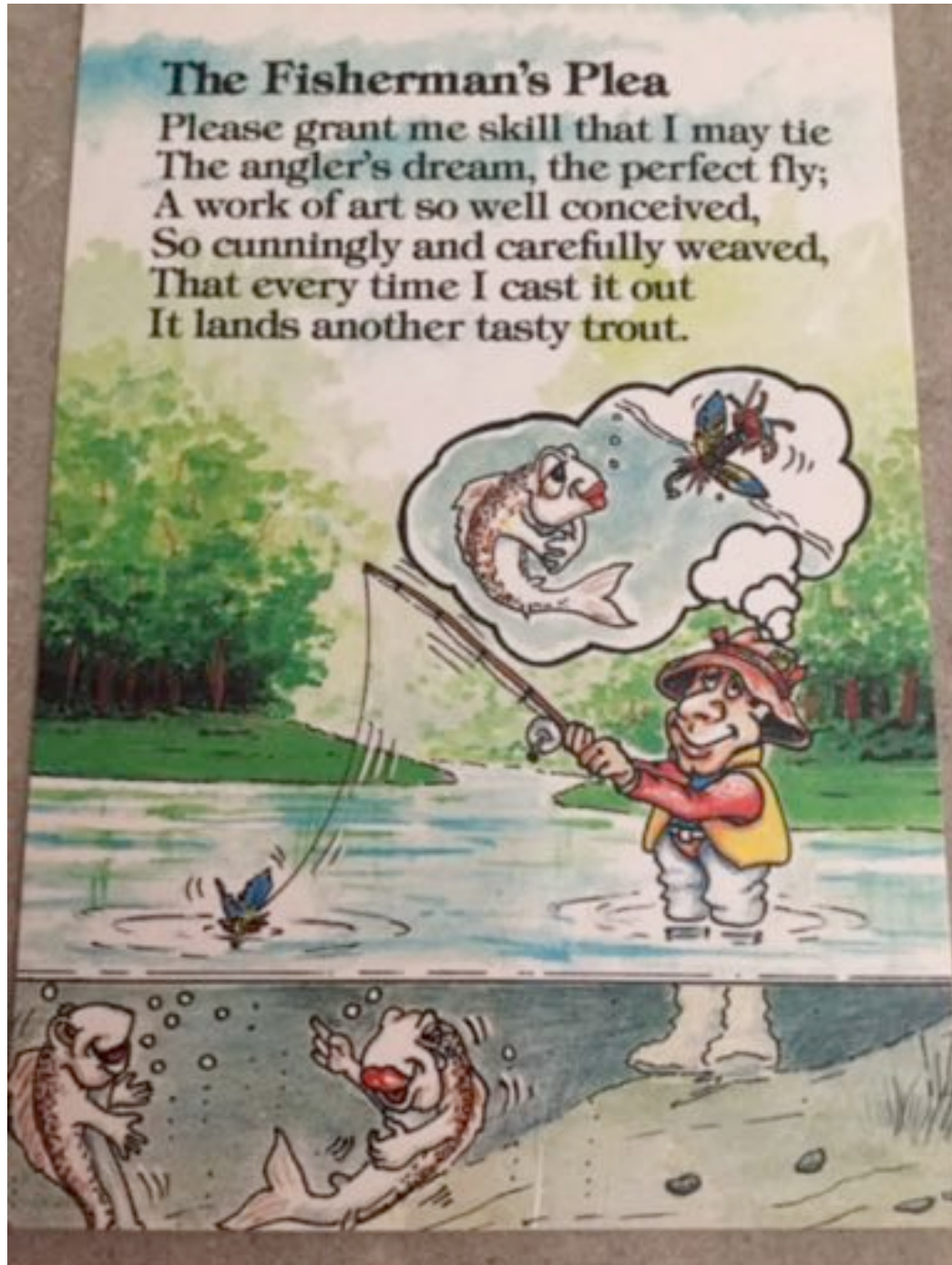

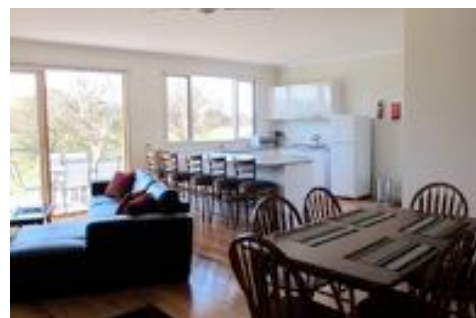
