
Bill's Book Notes

Chris Dawson wrote the book Woolly Worms and Wombats: A sidelong look at fishing down under. The story of an American's experiences flyfishing in New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania and in the North and South islands of New Zealand. The author, when a senior writer with the Calgary Herald, had ten months to spend as he wished and decided to "Come down under" to flyfish the lands of kookaburra's, kiwis and twenty four inch trout. Dawson took a backwoods approach to his trip and tells his story in an interesting but with a "bit of tongue in his cheek" humour. "Dawson understands that there's more to a long fishing trip than fish. There are people, places, customs, beers and in this case Kangeroos."-John Gierach. Euro Nymphing Workshop - Thurs 19 September 2019

At 7:00pm on Thursday 19 September 2019, 16 Southern Flyfishing members assembled at the clubrooms for what turned out to be a very informative and useful session on European/Czech nymphing.

It was the first of a two (2) part instructional process. Part one being an introduction and part two being a practical application of the principles learned in the first session.

Joint session presenters, **Garry Mulvay** and **Ross Bailey** - both experienced competition flyfishers delivered a program including . . .

- Why? (would we adopt a European/Czech style nymphing technique)
- The type and purpose of equipment employed Leader set-up and its function
- Various flies and styles of flies used

The range of questions and commentary, indicated that the lively presentation was well appreciated by those present. Eager participation in the practical aspects of leader constructs were another indication of a valuable information night.

A date is not confirmed as yet, but during October, a follow-up practical demonstration and participation day will be held on a yet to be determined water course. All members are invited to attend. Look for advice in coming communications.

The competition was fierce and exciting with the Suzic girls and Thompson boys going fish for fish on opposite sides of the lake and it didn't stop all day.

The official competition started at 9.30 after Tony briefed members on the rules and flies were allocated. Bill Tilley found a few new friends at lunch after winning a bottle of premium Pinot Gris for drawing the secret Max K. fly at the briefing.

Large numbers of fish up to 13.5 lb. were landed and released. Highlight of the morning being Tony taking a brief swim up to the neck when the bank collapsed while attempting to net a fish. No sympathy extended.

Thanks to Tony Hyett, Heather and Peter Suzic for helping organise the BBQ, drinks, salads and Patsy for also organising prizes for the kids.

Great fun day had by all at a well organised event in memory of Max Kepert.




















"Charles Bradley" Flies for Sale
