WEBSITE REFRESH

NEW ZEALAND IN THE NEW YEAR

With the (promised) lifting of the Covid restrictions and continuing international travel restrictions, fishing in New Zealand is again increasingly popular with Australian fly fishers. Hurley’s currently have 7 places available for their 7 day, all-inclusive “Southland Guided Adventures” package which starts on 23 January 2022.

It would be great to book it as a Club trip.

The package includes airport pickup/drop off, meals, accommodation, licences and is fully guided but excludes airfares and insurance.

If we can get together at least 6 members, the cost is \$3,000 per person – but we have to be quick.

A \$500 deposit will be required to secure your booking.

4X4 DRIVING WITH THE SOUTHERN FLY FISHERS.

Day 1

We were out on the road to meet up at a café to have breaky. After we all met down at the café we were back on the road to the campsite but we took a few breaks to figure out exactly where to go. After we had gotten to the dirt track, we took some air out of the tires and we continued on that dirt track. Day 2

from the top of the mountain to a river crossing and stopped at the river to collect some water in jugs. We continued down that road until we came to the next river crossing. We stopped there as well to see if we would stay down in the valley or camp up in the high country. I wanted to camp in the high country because I had never done so and we agreed to do that. We got back in the cars and kept climbing up the mountain. We got up to the top of the mountain and stopped at a place with a table to eat some food. There was a bit of snow so my dad and I made snowballs and threw them at each other. Everything is ready to go and as soon as the Club is fully functional, the draw will once again be held at the Monthly General Meetings on the fourth Wednesday of each month.



If you have a love for vodka and adventure, then tie up some mice patterns and try Kamchatka in Russia – an amazing destination. Click on the link below to see for yourself.




